EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The UAE Cyber Security Council has observed that Google has released security updates to address multiple vulnerabilities in the Chrome browser.

TECHNICAL DETAILS:

Google has released security updates for the Chrome browser to address multiple vulnerabilities. Successful exploitation of these vulnerabilities would enable an attacker to: execute arbitrary code, install programs, view, change, or delete data, and create new accounts with full user rights within the context of the logged-on user.

This update includes 3 security fixes, including the following:

High Severity Vulnerabilities

- CVE-2025-0611: Object corruption in V8
 - This vulnerability could allow attackers to exploit the V8 JavaScript engine to corrupt objects in memory, potentially leading to arbitrary code execution
- CVE-2025-0612: Out of bounds memory access in V8
 - This flaw involves accessing memory locations outside the intended boundaries within the V8 engine, which could cause browser crashes or allow attackers to execute malicious code

Fixed Versions:

- The Stable channel update:
 - o Chrome 132.0.6834.110/111 for Windows, Mac and 132.0.6834.110 for Linux
- Chrome 131 (132.0.6834.122) for Android

RECOMMENDATIONS:

The UAE Cyber Security Council recommends to update Google Chrome to the latest version.
