An Abu Dhabi economic delegation, led by the Abu Dhabi Department of Economic Development (ADDED), concluded a successful visit to Japan, signing agreements with government entities and the private sector to further enhance partnerships in various industries and high-growth clusters.

The Abu Dhabi economic delegation, comprising representatives from more than 80 public sector entities, private enterprises, SMEs, and start-ups, engaged in high-level meetings with top government officials, key businesses and investors in Japan, exploring collaboration opportunities in across key sectors including the life sciences, carbon-neutral technologies, AI, digital infrastructure, robotics, advanced manufacturing, and financial services.

The delegation visited Expo 2025 Osaka and SusHi Tech – Tokyo, and organised the 11th Abu Dhabi Japan Economic Council (ADJEC) meeting, the Abu Dhabi Investment Forum (ADIF) and Abu Dhabi-Japan Business Forum, highlighting cooperation opportunities and the role of Abu Dhabi's Falcon Economy initiatives in accelerating transition towards a smart, diversified, and sustainable development.

12 homegrown startups, supported by Hub71 and Khalifa Fund, participated in SusHi Tech- Tokyo, Asia's premier startup and innovation confer-

ence, highlighting Abu Dhabi's tech talent, solutions, and investment opportunities in innovation-driven industries.

Organised in partnership with the UAE Embassy in Tokyo, the visit included meetings with His Excellency Hirofumi Yoshimura, Governor of Osaka, Her Excellency Yuriko Koike, Governor of Tokyo, His Excellency Nobuhiko Yamaguchi, Vice Governor of Osaka, His Excellency Ogushi Masaki, State Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry, His Excellency Takeuchi Shinji, Parliamentary Vice-Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI), and His Excellency Kodaira Nobuyori, President of the Japan Cooperation Center for the Middle East (JCCME). The delegation also met senior officials and executives of the Osaka Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Japan Business Federation (Keidanren), Sumitomo Corporation, Cosmo Energy, ITOCHU, and Toshiba.

His Excellency Ahmed Jasim Al Zaabi, Chairman of ADDED, said: "Guided by our leadership's ambitious vision, we are doubling down on our efforts to future-proof the economy and cement Abu Dhabi's stature as a rising economic powerhouse and a global hub for talent, business, investment, and trade.

"Our visit to Japan presented a valuable opportunity to fur-

ther strengthen our longstanding partnership by exploring new avenues of collaboration in various sectors. The agreements signed during this visit reinforce our commitment to deepening partnerships across priority industries and clusters to address giga shifts in the global economy. We remain committed to enhancing cooperation with key economies and trading partners, making human development and sustainability our top priorities to shape a brighter tomorrow."

The agreements signed during the visit included a strategic partnership for smart mobility solutions between Emirates Driving Company and Zenmov, a leading company in smart mobility solutions, and Abu Dhabi Chamber and the Japan External Trade Organization (JETRO) agreement to deepen business relations and create new opportunities for collaboration.

The Emirates Foundation's Nema initiative and Japan International Cooperation Center (JICE) inked an agreement to bolster cooperation to support achieving Nema's goal of reducing food loss and waste by 50 per cent by 2030, in line with the UAE's National Food Security Strategy 2051 and U.N. Sustainable Development Goals.

His Excellency Shihab Ahmed Alfaheem, Ambassador of the UAE to Japan, said: "The visit of the Abu Dhabi



economic delegation to Japan underscores the strength and strategic depth of the UAE-Japan relationship — one that is rooted in decades of trust and collaboration, and now firmly focused on the future. Japan's global leadership in digital innovation, smart infrastructure, sustainable mobility, and advanced manufacturing aligns closely with Abu Dhabi's economic diversification goals and its ambition to build a resilient, knowledge-based, and climate-conscious economy.

"This mission represents a pivotal moment in our bilateral ties, as we prepare to activate transformative frameworks such as the Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA). CEPA will provide unprecedented access to markets, streamline cross-border investment, and

Bilateral trade between the UAE and Japan rose 4.8 per cent to AED182.4 billion (US\$49.7 billion) in 2024, compared to AED174 billion (US\$47.4 billion) in 2023, while non-oil trade grew 2.2 per cent

over the same period, reflecting growing ties between the two economies. UAE investment in Japan has increased 100 per cent over the past five years, while the country accounts for 80 per cent of Japanese investments in the Middle East.

The Abu Dhabi economic delegation included senior officials and executives from government entities, private sector's companies, and start-ups, including the Department of Culture and Tourism – Abu Dhabi, Abu Dhabi Securities Exchange (ADX), ADGM, Abu Dhabi Investment Office (ADIO), Abu Dhabi Customs, Khalifa Fund for Enterprise Development, Abu Dhabi Chamber of Commerce and Industry (ADCCI), ADNOC, KEZAD, Hub71, Abu Dhabi Airports, and major companies from different sectors.

ADGM FSRA Publishes 2025-2026 Business Plan, Enhancing its Regulatory Framework and Driving Sustainable Growth

The Financial Services Regulatory Authority (FSRA) of ADGM has published its Business Plan for 2025-2026, outlining the strategic priorities that will emphasise its role as a progressive regulator and one that is already recognised globally. The Plan underscores the FSRA's commitment to supporting the economic ambitions of Abu Dhabi and the UAE more widely.

The Business Plan lays out an agenda for the next two years and focuses on key regulatory priorities such as maintaining international regulatory alignment, combatting financial crime, enhancing operational resilience, fostering responsible financial innovation and advancing sustainable finance. The ongoing initiatives outlined in the plan will build on the hallmarks of the FSRA's existing regulatory framework, namely risk-sensitivity, proportionality, innovation and stakeholder engagement. The FSRA will continue

strengthening its alignment with international regulatory standards by working closely with leading global standard-setting bodies. Preventing financial crime will remain a key priority, with strengthened supervisory, enforcement, and technological capabilities to combat money laundering, terrorist financing, proliferation financing, the financing of unlawful organisations, and sanctions breaches. The FSRA will also reinforce its focus on operational resilience through enhanced regulatory measures targeting cyber threats, supply chain disruptions, fraud, and geopolitical risks.

The Business Plan further highlights the FSRA's continued efforts in championing responsible innovation through the development of progressive regulatory frameworks and the expansion of its SupTech and RegTech capabilities. In parallel, it is driving the region's sustainable finance agenda by supporting the

issuance of green, climate transition, and sustainability-linked products while updating regulations to incorporate climate-related risk management in line with the UAE's net-zero ambitions and global sustainability standards.

Overall, the FSRA's 2025-2026 strategy reaffirms its commitment to continued collaboration with regulated entities, national and international bodies, and industry stakeholders as well as its drive to maintain ADGM's position as a world-class financial centre.

Commenting on the Business Plan, Emmanuel Givanakis, CEO of ADGM's FSRA, said, "As a progressive and internationally recognised regulator, the FSRA remains committed to strengthening our international standing, upholding market integrity, and fostering sustainable growth. Over the next two years, we will continue to enhance our regulatory framework in line with



evolving global best practices, combat financial crime through innovative regulatory and enforcement measures, and advance responsible technological innovation to ensure that ADGM has a secure, well-regulated, and forward-looking financial ecosystem.

ADGM FSRA Proposes Enhancements to Cyber Risk Management



The Financial Services Regulatory Authority (FSRA) of ADGM has published Consultation Paper No. 3 of 2025 to invite feedback on proposed amendments to its regulatory framework for Authorised Persons and Recognised Bodies in relation to cyber risk management.

The proposed amendments build upon the FSRA's Information Technology Risk Management Guidance and Governance Principles and Practices to Mitigate Cyber Threats and Crime, which

outline best practices for managing information technology risks.

ADGM Registration Authority Publishes Consultation Paper on Retail Consumer Protection Regulations

The ADGM's Registration Authority (RA) has issued a Consultation Paper to explain and seek public feedback on the proposed Consumer Protection Regulations 2025.

Consumer protection laws are essential to safeguard consumer welfare, reinforce consumer confidence, and enhance a reliable retail market economy. Given ADGM's recent expansion to Al Reem Island and the considerable number of 'Category C' (retail) licence holders in ADGM, the RA considers it

necessary to introduce a robust retail consumer protection framework in ADGM.

This Consultation Paper is of interest to all entities engaging in 'Category C' retail activities in ADGM, either through an ADGM commercial licence or temporary permit, or those seeking to be licensed by ADGM, and offer any products or services to consumers.

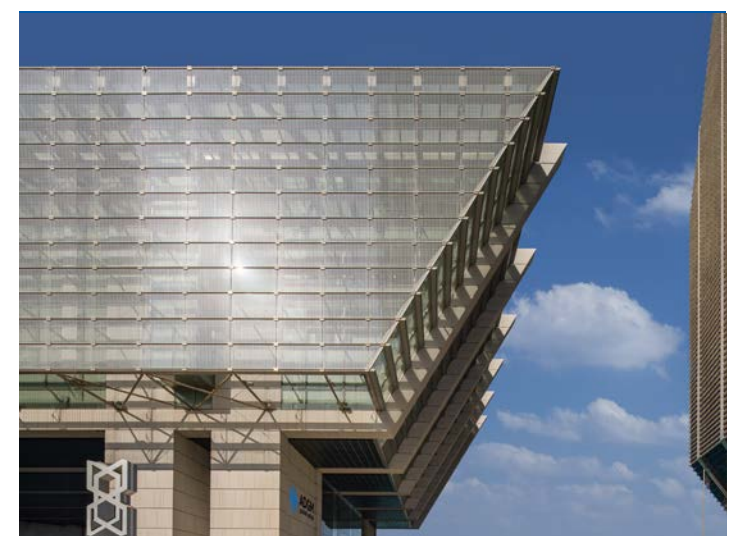
The key features of the RA's proposals are the introduction of certain obligations on a provider, such as, but not limited to product labelling,

instructions on the use and installation of products, seeking approvals from the Registrar before announcing any promotions or sales, disclosing the condition of a used or refurbished product at the point of sale; refraining from using misleading advertisements for a product or service; prohibiting the use of terms in any contract or invoice issued to the consumer that would cause a consumer harm; providing consumers with product warranties; and procedures surrounding defective prod-

ucts or services.

The RA is also proposing to establish a consumer complaint handling channel and grant the Registrar the power to receive and assess complaints and issue notices of determination in response to consumer complaints and to impose financial penalties for breaches of the proposed Regulations. The consultation period will close on 8 June 2025.

New Energy Investor Summit Middle East 2025 Unites Global Leaders to Accelerate Green Investments

Abu Dhabi hosted a major milestone in the global energy transition with the successful convening of the New Energy Investor Summit Middle East 2025 at ADGM. The event brought together leading figures in policy, finance, sustainability, and energy development with the aim of catalyzing investment in renewable energy and green infrastructure across the Middle East and beyond. It underscored the United Arab Emirates' growing role as a global hub for sustainable finance and innovation.

Centered around the theme "Bridging the Gap Between Capital and Projects," the summit served as a dynamic platform for aligning capital with concrete climate solutions. It featured high-level dialogues, expert panels, and collaborative discussions designed to unlock investment in technologies such as green hydrogen, sustainable aviation

fuel, and infrastructure critical to the decarbonization effort.

"A substantial gap exists between the amount of finance needed to achieve our ambitious net zero goals, and where we stand today," said H.H. Sheikha Shamma bint Sultan bin Khalifa Al Nahyan in her opening remarks. "Platforms like the New Energy Investor Summit are vital to unlocking capital, driving innovation, and strengthening collaboration. Similarly, initiatives like the UICCA's UAE Carbon Alliance, Policy Hack series, and its Launchpad programme, are all part of a broader effort to build a robust, inclusive climate ecosystem. By aligning public and private efforts, we can accelerate investment in clean technologies and advance carbon markets to support climate action – while growing the green economy."

The summit's first session focused on national and

regional policy frameworks that support decarbonisation. Topics ranged from regulatory incentives to aligning infrastructure planning with long-term climate goals.

H.E. Hamad Sayah Al Mazrouei highlighted the UAE's strategic positioning, stating: "The New Energy Investor Summit reinforces ADGM's position as a global leader in climate innovation and further solidifies Abu Dhabi's role as the home of Green Capital. As the world faces an urgent demand for climate action, we find ourselves at a pivotal moment where the need to connect investment with innovation, has never been more critical. Today, we are building the bridges that will link capital with climate solutions, align ambition with tangible action, and unite policymakers, investors, and innovators".

Horst H. Mahmoudi, Executive Chairman of Smartenergy, echoed the sentiment,



noting, "Our venture into the UAE is a strategic decision to place Smartenergy at the nexus of the world's emerging new energy hubs. Under its visionary leadership, the UAE is spearheading the worldwide push towards clean and renewable energy. We are committed to supporting these initiatives by catalysing green molecule markets. The New Energy Investor Summit is helping us to create a bridge between continents to capitalise on the emerging opportunities offered by the current renewable energy market."

The sessions explored synergies between the Middle East,

Africa, and Europe. Panelists delved into transcontinental hydrogen corridors, harmonization of certification standards, and joint R&D initiatives. As green hydrogen emerges as a cornerstone in the race to net zero, industrial-scale green molecule production was also discussed, highlighting the increasing demand for sustainable fuels such as hydrogen, ammonia, and methanol.

Experts explored blended finance models, sovereign guarantees, and green bonds as tools to derisk large investments and mobilize private capital, including transparent regulation and long-term

offtake agreements, essential components to secure investor confidence.

With participation from multilateral institutions, private investors, and government representatives, the event fostered a comprehensive dialogue on enabling frameworks and capital deployment strategies.

By forging links between finance and innovation, and strengthening international cooperation, the summit has set a new benchmark for green investment in the Middle East, reinforcing Abu Dhabi's emerging identity as the Capital of Green Capital.

Coinbase Launches Institutional Fund Offering Yield on Bitcoin



Coinbase Asset Management has launched a new fund that aims to deliver a regular yield on a customer's Bitcoin holdings. The Coinbase Bitcoin Yield Fund will seek a 4% to 8% annualized net return, delivered in Bitcoin, and is only open to non-US institutional investors.

The fund employs a version of the so-called basis trade that is common in other financial realms. In the crypto version of the strategy, known as the cash-and-carry trade, traders look to take advantage of discrepancies between the price of Bitcoin and the price of derivatives tied to Bitcoin, known as perpetual swaps, or perps for short, which are essentially futures contracts that don't expire. While the two prices should move in tandem, they are often disconnected, particularly when bullish traders are eager to capitalize on the rising price of Bitcoin and are willing to pay more to keep their perp positions open.

The dislocation between perps and spot Bitcoin prices tends to be the biggest — offering the most opportunity for profit — when the price of Bitcoin is going up. The

yield is likely to be smaller or even negative when prices are going down. Investors will buy shares of the fund by depositing Bitcoin and will later be able to withdraw the underlying Bitcoin on a monthly basis.

The fund should allow investors to garner a yield on their Bitcoin holdings, which will make Bitcoin more competitive with other cryptocurrencies, like Ethereum and Solana, that can earn a yield through a blockchain-native process known as staking.

"Coinbase AM believes that the next cycle needs better products to enable institutional investment in digital assets," said Sebastian Bea, President at Coinbase Asset Management. "We believe the Bitcoin Yield Fund is particularly well suited to the task, given its conservative and compliant investment strategy."

Many offshore hedge funds are already generating yields on Bitcoin through basis trades, while Ethena, a crypto project that has attracted billions of dollars, gives smaller investors an opportunity to receive the returns from Ether-focused basis trades.

The kind of basis trade

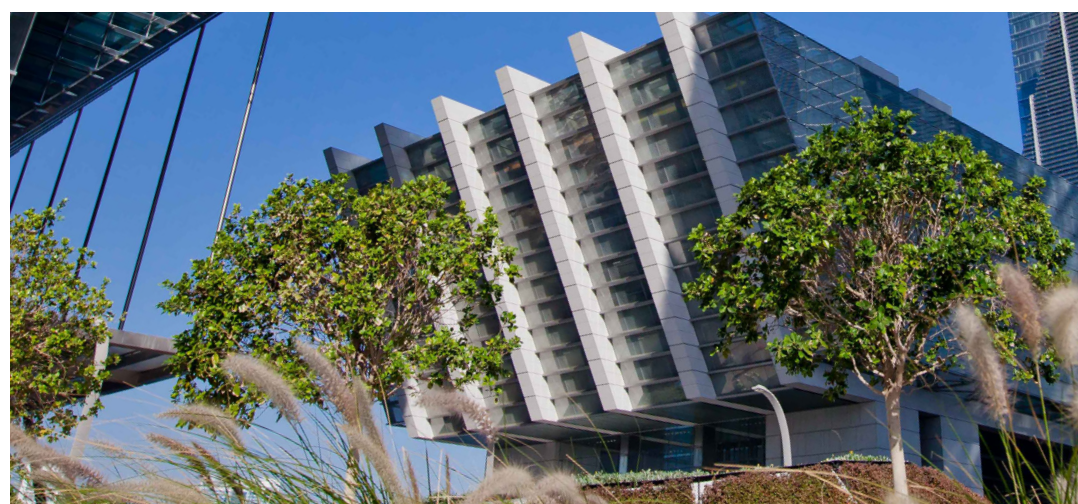
that the new fund is using is relatively low risk. But basis trades have gone wrong in notable ways in the past, particularly when firms have borrowed against their holdings to deliver bigger returns. The Coinbase fund is set to take on some leverage, but at a low level, the company says.

The fund aims to keep the underlying Bitcoin safe by holding them with Coinbase and "other qualified custodians." The company warns investors that while it is targeting a return above 4%, "actual performance may differ materially." The company, though, says that it will be safer than competing products that "take too much investment and operational risks."

The fund is seeded by several investors including Aspen Digital, an Abu Dhabi-based private wealth management platform. The CEO of Aspen Digital, Elliot Andrews, said "Coinbase is the most trusted counterparty in the asset class and combined with a huge amount of investor demand for Bitcoin yield, we are looking forward to bringing this product to the private wealth market."

and innovation.

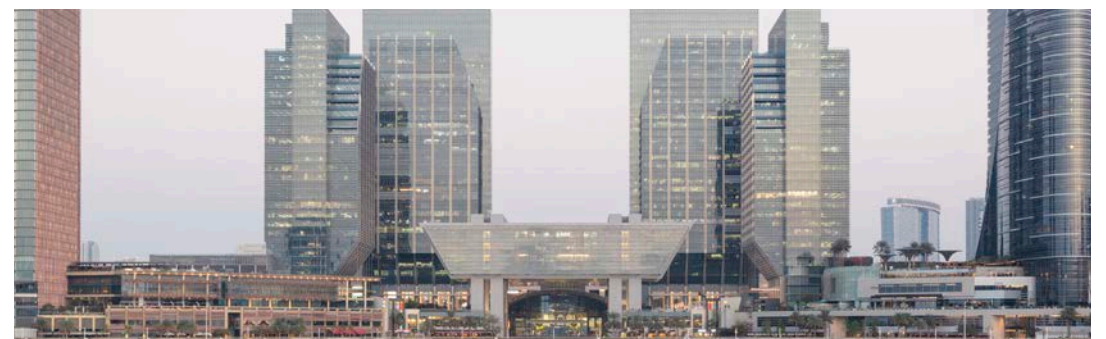

Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi and US President Attend UAE-US Business Dialogue

His Highness Sheikh Khaled bin Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi, and US President Donald Trump have attended the UAE-US Business Dialogue, held at Qasr Al Watan in Abu Dhabi.

The event highlighted ongoing and future areas of collaboration between the two countries across a broad range of shared interests. It also reviewed progress under the landmark US\$1.4 trillion investment plan in the US, announced in Washington, DC earlier this year, through which Emirati investment institutions are contributing to strategic sectors such as energy, artificial intelligence, advanced technology, and industry.

Held as part of President Trump's state visit to the UAE, which began on Thursday, the dialogue aimed to expand economic and investment cooperation between the two countries, in support of economic growth, job creation, and innovation in both nations.

Several new agreements were announced during the event across key sectors including energy, healthcare, aviation, industry, AI, advanced



technology, entertainment, sports, and tourism.

In the energy sector, strategic agreements were announced to facilitate up to US\$60 billion in American investments in UAE energy projects. These included ADNOC's development plan with ExxonMobil to boost production capacity at the Upper Zakum offshore field; a separate agreement with Occidental to explore increasing capacity at the Shah Gas field; and the awarding of a new concession for unconventional oil and gas exploration in Abu Dhabi

to EOG Resources. In addition, XRG signed a framework agreement with Occidental's subsidiary 1PointFive to explore a major investment in a direct air capture (DAC) facility in Texas. The two sides also agreed to launch a comprehensive strategic partnership in the energy sector.

In aviation, Etihad Airways, the national airline of the UAE, confirmed an order for 28 Boeing 787 and 777X aircraft, equipped with GE engines, as part of its ongoing fleet expansion strategy.

In technology and innovation, Abu

Dhabi Investment Office (ADIO) announced a partnership with Qualcomm to establish an advanced global engineering centre in Abu Dhabi focused on next-generation IoT, AI, and data centre solutions. The facility will become Qualcomm's newest global engineering hub and will support strategic initiatives in the emirate through collaboration with local and international companies based in Abu Dhabi. It will also strengthen the UAE's global engineering capabilities by delivering tailored products and services across key sectors such as energy, industry, logistics, retail, and smart mobility.

Additionally, e& and Qualcomm announced collaboration to accelerate the development of advanced connectivity, 5G, and AI technologies, supporting digital transformation in key government and industrial sectors. e& also launched a sovereign cloud platform in the UAE in partnership with Amazon Web Services, designed to accelerate the adoption of cloud computing and AI across multiple sectors. The UAE Sovereign Launchpad, powered by AWS, delivered by e&, and endorsed by the UAE Cybersecurity Council, marks a new era in public cloud enablement across the country.

In manufacturing, Emirates Global

Aluminium (EGA) announced progress in its plans to build the first new primary aluminium production plant in the US since 1980. EGA will invest US\$4 billion in the project. EGA also signed an agreement with the Tawazun Council and RTX to explore opportunities for developing gallium production capabilities in Abu Dhabi.

In the healthcare sector, several initiatives were announced focused on leveraging advanced technologies and research to accelerate medical innovation and improve patient outcomes. These included a collaboration between M42 and Oracle Health to enhance healthcare data systems and genomics capabilities using advanced technologies, and a joint initiative between G42, Oracle Health, and the Cleveland Clinic to launch a global AI-powered healthcare delivery platform.

In the sports, entertainment, and tourism sectors, both sides reviewed several joint initiatives, including the Disney Theme Park Resort project in Abu Dhabi. Abu Dhabi will continue hosting UFC championship events and NBA preseason games. The Guggenheim Abu Dhabi museum project is also on track to open in the UAE capital.

The joint venture signing ceremony was witnessed by Mr Eric Lombard, French Minister of Economy, Finance, and Industrial and Digital Sovereignty, and His Excellency Khaldoon Al Mubarak, Chairman of the Executive Affairs Authority and member of the Artificial Intelligence and Advanced Technology Council.

Together, the partners will develop Europe's first purpose-built intelligence hub supporting the full AI lifecycle, from model training and inference to deployment of generative and applied AI systems. Strategically located to integrate with France's

research and innovation ecosystems, the Campus will feature advanced compute infrastructure, facilities for experimentation, and real-world development environments.

The open platform will include exascale-class computing, sovereign cloud integration, and low-carbon hyperscale data centers optimised for AI. It will support large-scale AI adoption in fields such as healthcare, mobility, energy, finance, and manufacturing, while advancing Europe's digital and climate sovereignty.

Ahmed Yahia, Managing Director and CEO of MGX, said: "France has the ambition and capability to lead in this new AI era. At MGX, we see AI as the most transformative force of our time, and believe open, enduring infrastructure

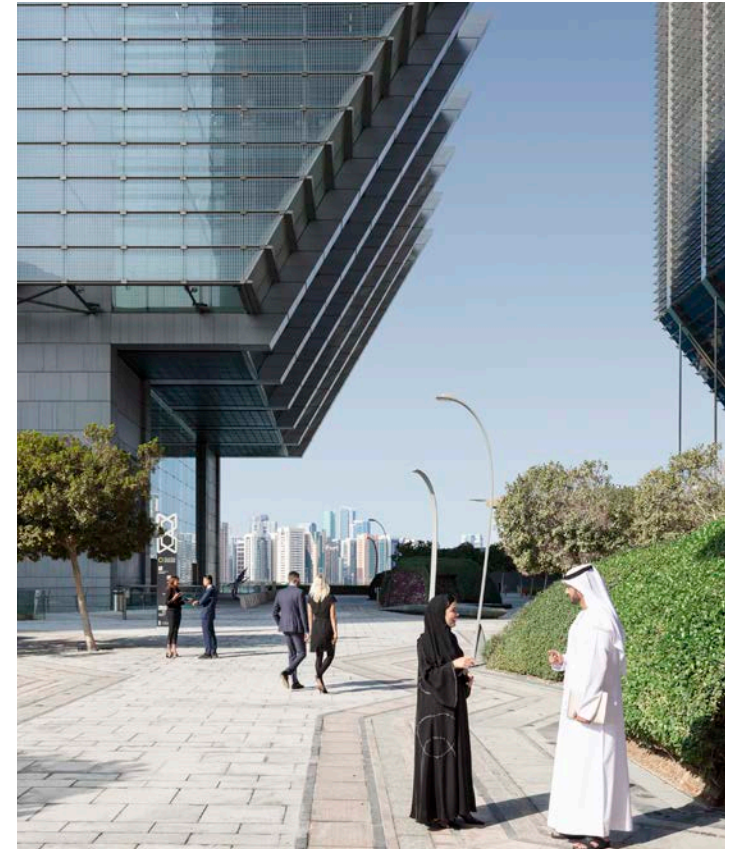

Powering the Transition: Kimmeridge's Strategic Expansion to ADGM

In the latest episode of ADGM Think, Oana Picincu, Manager in ADGM's Sustainable Finance team, sat down with Ben Dell, Managing Partner at Kimmeridge, to discuss the firm's recent strategic expansion into ADGM. Kimmeridge, a \$5.5 billion alternative asset manager focused exclusively on the energy sector, is at the forefront of integrating sustainability into its investment model—bridging traditional energy and the future of low-carbon solutions. **Why ADGM, Why Now?**

Kimmeridge's decision to establish a base in ADGM comes after nearly a decade of building relationships in the region. With early investment partnerships with Mubadala and ADIC dating back to 2016, the firm's presence in Abu Dhabi was a long-anticipated step. Dell explained that Abu Dhabi, alongside the US, is uniquely positioned to lead the energy transition. Both economies prioritize reliable, low-cost energy with the lowest possible carbon footprint and are poised to become frontrunners in AI-driven GDP growth.

The new office in ADGM serves as a strategic hub, connecting Kimmeridge's operations across North America and the Middle East and enabling a broader reach into emerging markets in Asia. "It's a platform for growth," Dell noted, citing countries like India, Vietnam, and Malaysia as key future energy demand centers.

Integrating Innovation in Conventional & Clean Energy

Kimmeridge has built a distinctive investment platform that spans the entire energy spectrum—from upstream oil and gas in Texas to carbon removal and afforestation projects. A prime example is its partnership with Mubadala Energy on a fully integrated gas platform, including upstream production and a liquefied natural gas (LNG) facility set to launch operations later this year. This "wellhead to water" strategy reflects Kimmeridge's pragmatic view of the energy transition: improving and decarbonizing existing systems while investing in new technologies and renewables.

Dell emphasized that addressing climate goals requires an "all of the above" strategy. "We need oil, gas, solar, wind, and storage," he said. "The real question is: What is the most cost-effective, scalable way to deliver low-carbon energy for a growing global economy?"

Profitability and Purpose in the Carbon Economy

One of the standout themes from the discussion was Kimmeridge's commitment to building profitable models in alternative energy. Through its Chestnut Carbon business, the firm buys and restores land for conservation, gener-

ating premium carbon credits. Unlike many ESG initiatives that struggle to scale, Kimmeridge focuses on financial viability. "The more money we make, the more restoration we can do," Dell stated.

Kimmeridge's disciplined entry into the carbon and renewable sectors reflects its long-term strategy: deliver top quartile returns while aligning with global sustainability goals. The firm's emphasis on profitability as a driver of climate action offers a compelling counterpoint to more traditional, less financially sustainable models.

Leading by Example in Sustainability

Kimmeridge has embedded ESG principles deeply into its operations. It was behind Civitas, the publicly listed US energy company to be net-zero for Scope 1 and 2 emissions. Its LNG business is on track to deliver the world's first net-zero cargoes, verified through rigorous emissions monitoring and carbon offsetting via sequestration and afforestation.

"We don't just talk the talk; we walk the walk," Dell said. High-quality emissions

tracking and transparent reporting are cornerstones of Kimmeridge's approach. Rather than shy away from revealing higher emissions due to better data, the firm embraces full accountability to set new industry standards.

Looking Ahead: Abu Dhabi's Role in Global Energy

Dell sees Abu Dhabi as a critical player in shaping the future energy system, particularly in demonstrating how nuclear, gas, renewables, and storage can be integrated. With its geological potential for carbon sequestration and expanding LNG capacity, the UAE is well-positioned to lead.

As AI accelerates demand for energy, Dell predicts a growing convergence between tech and energy sectors. "AI won't stop," he said, "and as long as the energy supply is there, it will keep growing."

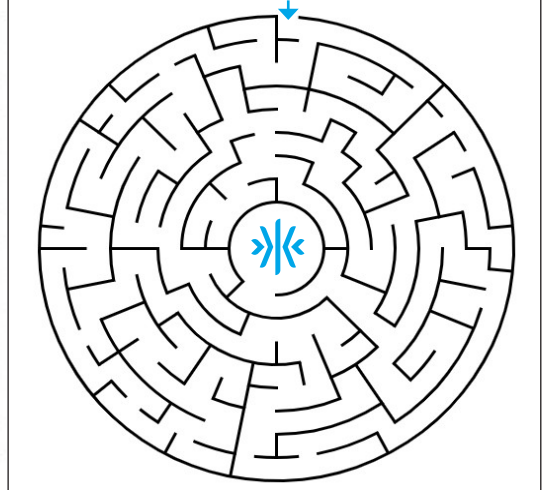
