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Dress Code Requirements

Everyone entering ADGM premises, including visitors, event guests, contractors, employees and ADGM clients shall comply with ADGM's dress code. People not complying with these guidelines shall not be granted access to the ADGM Authorities Building.

1. Everyone should maintain a decent and professional appearance.
2. Badges should be displayed at all times.
3. Unacceptable attire (male and female) may not be worn: clothing should not be transparent, indecently exposing parts of the body or displaying offensive pictures or slogans.

Male Dress Code Requirements



1. Men should be professionally attired and neatly groomed.
2. Male: GCC nationals
 - National (kandura, ghutra and eqal) dress in the familiar colours.
 - A jacket on top of the kandura is allowed.
3. Male: Non-GCC national
 - A business suit (a jacket, pants, shirt and tie), in dark and/or neutral colours.
 - Smart casual attire is allowed.
 - Beach attire is not permitted.

Female Dress Code Requirements

Ladies shall wear appropriate and modest business attire.

1. GCC national dress:



- GCC national dress (abaya and sheila) (sheila should be worn).
- The abaya should be loose fitting, with moderate decorations.
- The clothing under the abaya should be long, non-transparent and loose-fitting.

2. Non-GCC nationals:



- Formal business dress.
- Smart casual dress.
- Loose-fitting and modest clothing.
- Shirts and blouses must have sleeves.
- Skirts and dresses should cover the knees when seated.

0 - 1.3 *Uniformed Entrants to ADGM*

Representatives of the military, police and other uniformed personnel should wear uniforms.

0 - 1.4 *Contractor and Supplier Dress Code Requirements*

1. Contractors who work within ADGM premises shall follow HSE rules and wear the required clothing and PPE.



2. Contractors and delivery personnel:

- Neat and tidy uniform
- Neat and tidy work clothes (non-uniform)
- Safety shoes, not flip-flops
